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Why Higher Education Management?

- **Expansion:** Increased number of students challenge universities and the quality of HE provision
- Funding: Scarce resources force universities to be more efficient and to acquire funds from other sources (industry, donors, students, etc.)
- Governance: Decentralising of decision-making from the state to the universities increases both autonomy and accountability
- Competition: New modes of funding, internationalisation, and marketisation increase competition of universities on a national and international level



→ These trends effect the internal governance structure of universities and require new management skills

DIES Seminars

Workshop-oriented events (ca. 40 persons) upon regional invitation in countries, where DIES does not yet run quality assurance projects.

DIES Visits

Germany-visits of delegations on a topic related to higher education management. Visits to German higher education institutions, discussions, best-practice examples

- Structure: Blended Learning approach: two seminar parts and a trainer-guided intermediate e-learning section
- Costs: Selected participants will receive a scholarship, which includes, among others, the course fee and the costs for accommodation and meals. Additional per-diems need to be covered by the participants/their home institutions



Development-Related Postgraduate Master Courses

- some 39 English Master programmes which are studied at a German university
- The portfolio includes mainly programmes in the fields of economic sciences, development cooperation, engineering, regional planning, agricultural and forest sciences, environmental sciences, medicine and public health, social and political sciences etc.
- Work experience needed
- Deadline: Depends, often July 31st!



Public Policy and Good Governance-Master Programmes (PPGG)

- Eight Master programmes at eight German universities
- Work experience not mandatory
- Deadline: July 31st!



The **DAAD** is also offering a full **PhD-scholarship programme** (up to 3.5 years) for all academic disciplines

Deadline: Sept. 30th!

Academic researchers can apply for **short term grants** (1-3 months)

Deadline: Oct. 31st!
